Many in DTLA and the Eastside consider the Westside to be elitist NIMBY's fighting more affordable housing in their neighborhoods.

- Mobility: Steve Twining (2 mins) Gave short update.

V. Guest Presentation

The Chair next introduced City Attorney Mike Feuer who spoke extensively on homelessness in the city and current effort to address the crisis, which he stressed requires strong community support. He described efforts by City Attorney's office to dispatch teams to interact with homeless individuals, a program to cooperate with LA County, use of low level citations for minor ordinance violations which substitute community service in place of fines. He also discussed converting old under used motels to house the homeless. Some members expressed reservations over the impact of these housing programs upon existing neighborhoods. No action was taken at this time.

In response to a questions concerning imposition of conditions upon liquor CUBs, he said there must be some showing of an actual nuisance that justifies the conditions, not simply potential problems.

The chair recognized Greg Good, the Mayor's Chief of Legislative and External Affairs who spoke briefly on the Affordable Housing Linkage Fee.
