## **MINUTES**

Board of Directors Breakfast | August 16, 2017, 8:30-10:00am

- I. Representatives in Attendance: Steve Twinning, BABCNC; Larry Watts, BCC; Chris Spitz, PPCC; Doug Fitzimmons, SORO NC; Mike Newhouse, VNC; Robert Schlesinger, BABCNC; and Sarah Auerswald, MVCC.
- II. Member Fitzimmons chaired the meeting and called it to order at 8:40.
- III. Upon a motion duly made and seconded, the posted June and July 2017 minutes were approved.
- IV. Guest Presentation (20 mins)
  - a. Assemblymember Richard Bloom, California District 50 spoke briefly and then answered questions concerning various issues, including homelessness, CEQA, SB 649and SB 35.

## V. Government Rep. Updates

- Mayor Garcetti's Office: Daniel Tamm was not present.
- Dept of City Planning: Lisette Covarrubias was not present.
- LADWP: Jason Stinnett gave a brief update on the Silverlake reservoir.
- LA City Councilmember Koretz's Office (CD 5) was not represented.
- LA City Councilmember Bonin's Office (CD 11): Debbie Dyner-Harris discussed the new trash hauling franchises for commercial and multi-family housing, the Great Streets initiative and street safety measures implemented and under consideration.
- LA City Attorney Feuer's Office was not present.
- Dept. of Neighborhood Empowerment: Mike Fong was not present.
- Board of Neighborhood Commissioners: Commissioner Eli Lipmen was not present.
- LA County Supervisor Sheila Kuehl's Office: Stephanie Cohen was not present.
- U.S. Representative Karen Bass's Office: Jacqueline Hamilton addressed issues related to the new flight patterns implented by the FAA which increased aircraft noise in some communities while lessening it in others. She also explained that Representative Bass continues to focus her legislative efforts on child welfare and healthcare issues, while being concerned about the Executive Branch efforts to depopulate the State Department, the EPA, and other agencies, while also threatening to undermine the ACA in various ways
- U.S. Representative Ted Lieu's Office: Janet Turner was not present.
- CA Senator Ben Allen's Office: was not represented.
- CA Assemblymember Richard Bloom's Office: Josh Kurpies was present but did not speak.
- CA Assemblymember Sebastian Ridley-Thomas's Office: Brian Ross Adams
- Re-Code LA Zoning Advisory Committee: Sharon Commins was not present.

- Homelessness: Member Steve Twinning suggested that the former WLA Courthouse might be suitable for sustainable housing.
- Housing Shortage- Member Auerswald expressed frustration that although the vast majority of people
  recognize the housing crisis in California and Los Angeles in particular, whenever a new multi-family housing
  is proposed, it faces community opposition. She suggested that WRAC sponsor a town hall to address
  housing issues generally and, in particular how to address the housing needs of young families who work in
  the Westside.

  - a. Member Fitzsimmons spoke of difficulties concerning oral advice from the City Attorney related to various subjects, including the Brown Act as applied to issues coming before an NC that does not implicate any financial interest on the part of NC members and the limitations on amending adopted resolutions involving the expenditure of NC funds. A meeting has been set with the City Attoreny's office to discuss these subjects.
  - b. **Discussion and possible action:** How can WRAC be more effective in strengthening its member councils? This was tabled.
  - c. Jack Silvers, M.D. spoke concerning the easing of parking requirements for psychotherapy and marriage and family counseling practices to allow them to more easily locate their offices in non-medical buildings. No action was taken.

- 1. Creation of a new tracking/tagging system with deadline alerts.
- 2. Align the date of the CEQA determination (whenever possible to be aligned with the entitlement determination).
- 3. Asking all applicants to voluntarily extend any determinative timelines at time of application submittal.
