VI. New Business

- A. Ride Sharing Motion – sponsored by Del Rey NC

The ____ Neighborhood/Community Council requests that the State of California mandate that localities be empowered to assess the impact on traffic and congestion of ride sharing services by mandating comprehensive data from ride sharing companies available for study. Data should include time spent on the road to and from their homes and between rides for all ridesharing drivers as compared to traffic that would be generated by private vehicles making each trip. The results of this survey should guide both local and state policy in regards to ridesharing and better understand our transportation system. Using such data, the City of Los Angeles should then establish benchmark dates prior to and after implementation of each ridesharing platform and study in a scientific manner using all data available to determine if ride sharing vehicles add to or lessen congestion within the City of Los Angeles.

- B. The _____ Neighborhood/Community Council requests that the Zoning Administrator follow precedent and deny drill-site approval of CEB industrial equipment within the residentially zoned Rancho Park Public Golf Course, and mandate all the following safety conditions:
 - 24/7 emissions monitoring using up-to-date laser-based equipment.
 - Annual compliance inspections by the ZA's office and Petroleum Administrator.
 - Mandatory periodic Reviews of Conditions on a 5-year cycle to allow for updating of ZA assigned conditions of use.
 - A clear emergency and accident reporting plan by which the oil company must notify LAFD, LAPD, the Petroleum Administrator, and Council District 5.

Facts and background:

1. Industrial oil drilling operations at Rancho Park Public Golf Course are ongoing and in close proximity to thousands of residents.
2. There is an extensive history at this drill-site of City Code violations, Conditions-of-Use violations, and repeated industrial accidents.

C. The _____ NC/CC urges the City to (1) deny a business license and/or Dockless Mobility Permit, or suspend and/or revoke any previously-issued business license and/or Dockless Mobility Permit, to any provider of Dockless Mobility Devices operating in the City that fails or refuses to cooperate fully with law enforcement in providing information about the user of its Dockless Mobility Device involved in an accident causing injury to another person; (2) if and as necessary, immediately enact additional regulations amending existing rules and/or data protection policies in the City's Dockless Mobility Pilot Program to provide for issuance of business licenses and/or Dockless Mobility Permits only upon condition that providers cooperate fully with law enforcement under the circumstances set forth above; and (3) provide for suspensions, followed by revocation hearings, of any such licenses and/or permits issued to Dockless Mobility Device providers that fail or refuse to comply fully with law enforcement under the circumstances set forth above. D. Motion to urge City Attorney to draft an ordinance to require Annual Compliance Inspections for all drill sites in the City of Los Angeles.

In 2018, City Council began work on a Code reform that would require Annual Compliance Inspections of all oil well sites Citywide, but since September 2018 the effort by City Council has stalled out. In September, Council voted (link: CF 18-0203) to direct the City Attorney to draft an ordinance that would require inspections, but the City Attorney has not drafted the ordinance and Council has not pushed for it.

E. Motion to support Los Angeles City Council Motion "Fair Work Week Ordinance" ([Council File: 19-0229](#)) (Motion sponsor: Jane Wishon)

The City Council motion calls for:

1. the Los Angeles City Council to request the City Attorney to draft a Fair Work Week ordinance that would require all retail businesses in Los Angeles with 300 or more employees globally, to provide workers with 14 days' notice of their schedule, right to rest between shifts of 10 hours, a good faith estimate of weekly work hours at time of hire including potential opportunities for full-time work and predictability pay, right to request schedule changes and ability to decline hours before and after schedule posting, and anti-retaliation protections for employees their rights under the ordinance;
2. the City Council instruct to Chief Legislative Analyst to report with an analysis of other cities' Fair Work Week policies; and
3. the City Council to instruct the Office of Wage Standards in the Bureau of Contract Administration to report on enforcement costs and procedures for a Los Angeles Fair Work Week policy.
