Project Update

Thank you for your ongoing interest and involvement in the Sepulveda Transit Corridor Project. We are continuing to review the more than 3,000 thoughtful comments received during the recent scoping period that ended in February 2022 and plan to hold a community meeting in June to report back on the scoping findings. In the meantime, we have posted updated [Frequently Asked Questions \(FAQs\)](#) on our project website.

Metro has also authorized the pre-Development Agreement (PDA) teams, LA SkyRail Express and Sepulveda Transit Corridor Partners, to continue their work on the project alternatives.

I-405 Sepulveda Pass ExpressLanes Project

Metro and Caltrans released a [Scoping Summary Report](#) and [video update](#) for the I-405 Sepulveda Pass ExpressLanes project, which is looking at options to implement

ExpressLanes on the 405 freeway through the Sepulveda Pass. Metro and Caltrans began the environmental review process for the project last summer with scoping in fall 2021, where the public provided feedback on project alternatives and what should be studied as part of the environmental studies. Since the completion of scoping, Metro and Caltrans are continuing to advance technical studies in preparation for the release of the Draft Environmental Impact Report and Environmental Impact Statement (EIR/EIS).

I-405 Comprehensive Multimodal Corridor Plan

I-405 is a critical node in our regional transportation system connecting major gateways and trade hubs, but is one of the top 10 congested highways in the United States. Metro has plans to make it easier to get around, with multiple efforts to improve travel and address congestion, and has just released its [Draft I-405 Comprehensive Multimodal Corridor Plan \(CMCP\)](#).
