# 7. New Business

- a. Motion (WRAC HOC/Jay Handal) -- Request Mayor to Consent to City Controller's Audit of Inside Safe:
  - "\_\_\_\_NC/CC, a member of the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils (WRAC), urges Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass to immediately consent to a full audit of the City's Inside Safe program by Los Angeles City Controller Kenneth Mejia."
- Motion (WRAC HOC/Jay Handal) Request Mayor and CAO to Disclose the sources of funding for the Inside Safe Program:
  - "\_\_\_\_NC/CC, a member of the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils (WRAC), urges Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass and/or the City Administrative Officer Matthew Szabo to disclose the full extent of all sources of funding for the City's Inside Safe program."
- c. Motion (WRAC HOC/Chris Spitz) Support CF 20-1376-S5 (Park):
  - "\_\_\_\_\_NC/CC, a member of the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils (WRAC), strongly supports CF 20-1376-S5 (Park), which calls for certain amendments of LAMC Sec. 41.18 and a report back by the City Attorney on the feasibility of amending 41.18 to prohibit encampments as per the Governor's model ordinance."
- d. Motion (PPCC/Chris Spitz) Oppose Legislation Mandating Housing Density without Funding Mechanisms

"The State of California has enacted a series of housing-related bills aimed at increasing residential density in cities and municipalities statewide, including SB 9, SB 10, and others. While the stated intent of these bills is is to address the statewide housing crisis, implementation of these measures

often places significant burdens on local government without providing the necessary infrastructure, services, or fiscal support. These mandates frequently override local planning authority, diminish the ability of cities to tailor land use to their unique needs and capacities, and strain existing infrastructure and funding resources.

- "\_\_\_\_\_ NC/CC, a member of the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils (WRAC), therefore:
- "1) requests that our elected state officials take steps to initiate a pause on all enacted legislation that provides for statewide housing density and/or streamlining mandates, unless and until clear funding mechanisms are identified and enacted to accompany the legislation, in order to support the resulting impact on infrastructure, public safety, and municipal services; and
- "2) opposes any pending and future legislation that proposes statewide housing density and/or streamlining mandates, unless clear funding mechanisms are identified to accompany any such bills, in order to support the resulting impact on infrastructure, public safety, and municipal services.

"The imposition of increased density — without accompanying state funding or resource allocation — exacerbates existing challenges, particularly in areas vulnerable to wildfire, evacuation constraints, and other environmental or geographic hazards, such as the Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone, Flood Zones or other environmentally sensitive locations as determined by local governments throughout the state."

Request CW Yaroslavsky to Send Similar Letter re Governor's Executive Order # N-1-24 / Addressing Encampments on State Land in CD 5 September 2024 (passage deadline June 2025). 7 councils adopted: BABCNC, BCC, NCWP, PPCC, WLASNC, WNC, WWNC Note/C. Spitz comments: Motion pending with numerous extensions for 9 months; only 3 councils in CD 5 have taken up or passed the motion since February 2025 (4 mos. ago); circumstances relating to homelessness in LA city and county have changed since the Governor's E.O. was signed in May 2024, more than a year ago; the motion is arguably now moot.
- b. 24.13. Support for Brentwood Community Council Resolution and Requests to LA County Board of Supervisors September 2024 (passage deadline June 2025). 6 councils adopted: BABCNC, BCC, NCWP,\* PPCC, WLASNC, WWNC (\*modified version). Note/C. Spitz comments: Motion pending with numerous extensions for 9 months; no additional councils have taken up or passed the motion since January 2025 (5 mos. ago); circumstances relating to homelessness in LA city and county have changed since the BCC resolution (basis for the motion) was adopted in August 2024, more than 10 mos. ago; the motion is arguably now moot.

- c. 25.05. Allocation of Revenues from Bus Lane Violation Enforcement Pilot Program February 2025 (passage deadline June 2025). 7 councils adopted: BABCNC, BCC, NCWP, VNC, WLASNC, WNC, WWNC. Note/C. Spitz comments: The motion has been extended once.
